Ohio River Foundation, a regional conservation non-profit organization, is seeking a part-time regular position to support our Education and Restoration efforts. The ideal candidate is creative, enthusiastic, and hardworking, with a strong interest in environmental education, working with children, and habitat restoration via the removal of invasive plant species and planting native plant species. We need fun-loving, dependable, employees who don't mind all kinds of weather, rain or shine, hot or cold.

JOB RESPONSIBILITIES

- Work with the education team to conduct field trips and in-classroom programs for grades K-12. Activities and topics include: biodiversity, life cycles and food webs, earth science, wildlife observation, biological sampling, water quality testing, ecosystem and watershed concepts, and safety review
- Manage and maintain educational and scientific equipment
- Teacher communication
- Assist with program development
- Restoration project assistance and coordination including invasive species removal, native species planting, and working with and communicating with volunteers.

PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE AND QUALIFICATIONS

- College coursework in biology, ecology, or related field
- Education coursework or experience with children in an education setting preferred
- Understanding of or willingness to learn various conservation practices.
- Strong communication skills desired; ability to work independently, self-directed, and as a team member
- Ability to make decisions quickly and independently and shift schedules and priorities to meet changing conditions.

- This position requires lifting and carrying equipment (up to 50 lbs.).
- Physical demands and work environment regularly require work outdoors in wooded areas, waterways, and uneven natural paths.

- Work in a variety of weather conditions such as temperatures ranging from below freezing to over 100 degrees Fahrenheit, high winds, intense sunshine, rain, and snow.
