



Mussels in the Classroom


Through ORF's Mussels in the Classroom program (MIC), students get the chance to play host to and learn about freshwater mussels and their importance to river ecosystems. ORF launched MIC, the only program of its kind, in 2017.

Under the guidance of ORF staff, students gained hands-on science experience immersed in our local watershed and explored careers in conservation.


Students learned what it takes to be an environmental steward and lead their school and community toward conservation solutions.







Student Conservation Leadership Course



13 high school students participated

Students completed bio-assessments, chemical analysis, invasive plant species removal, electrofishing, tagged freshwater mussels and so much more!













INVASIVE SPECIES REMOVAL PROJECT MANAGEMENT AND BARRIER REMOVALS

NATIVE PLANTINGS



Highlights

- Protected over 44 acres of pollinator habitat and native woodland management
- Thousands of invasive plants and trees were removed by ORF and volunteers
- **15,457** native trees planted on areas previously cleared of invasive plants
- 10 community & corporate volunteer events, attended by 94 volunteers logging 295 hours of volunteer participation









Highlights

- \$50,000 grant from Cargill via the Global Water Challenge (GWC) program.
- 15,425 live stakes along nearly 6 miles of the creek in Lewisburg and Germantown, Ohio.
- Multi-year project (\$125,000 committed) phases 2 and 3 to be completed in 2024 and 2025.



Highlights

 ORV CISMA is a coalition of nonprofits, agencies, and businesses working to share information and resources to control and remove invasive species in a 22-county area in the Ohio River Valley.

Barrier Removal

Barrier removal restores a waterway's natural flow which helps native species, eliminates algal blooms, and creates safer conditions for recreation.



WATER QUALITY



ORF signed on to several letters and petitions with regional and national partners pertaining to water quality issues including more stringent regulation of forever chemicals.

SACKETT V. EPA



The court's decision will exclude tens of millions of acres of wetlands from the Clean Water Act's oversight. ORF will continue to advocate on behalf of wetlands, and the communities that depend on them.

OHIO RIVER WATERSHED ADVOCACY COALITION



ORF is working with partners to create an advocacy coalition to collaborate on water quality issues and the development of an Ohio River watershed ecosystem restoration program, with enforceable goals.







Expenses (Total: \$575,168)






